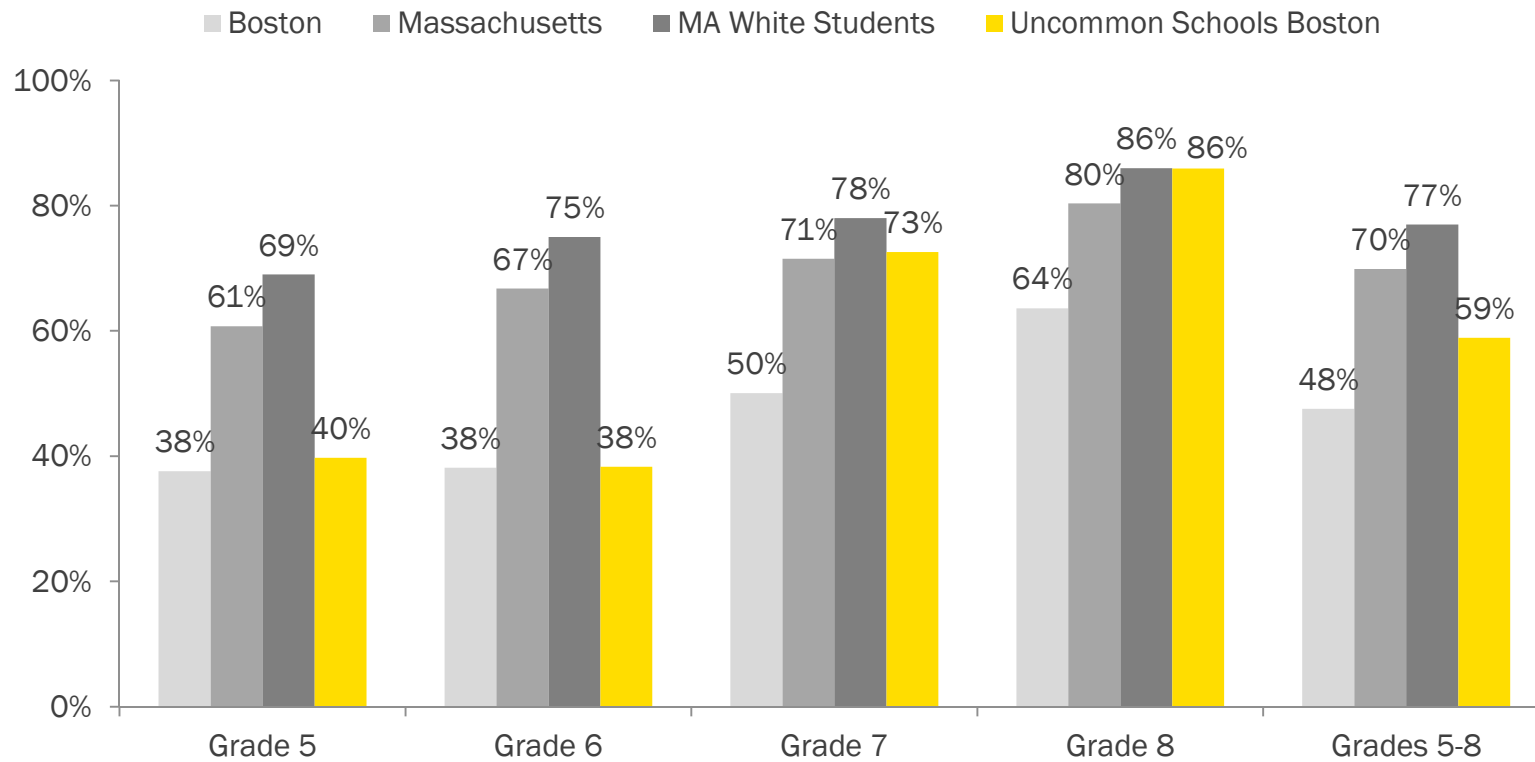

2012 Massachusetts ELA Exam, Grades 6-8

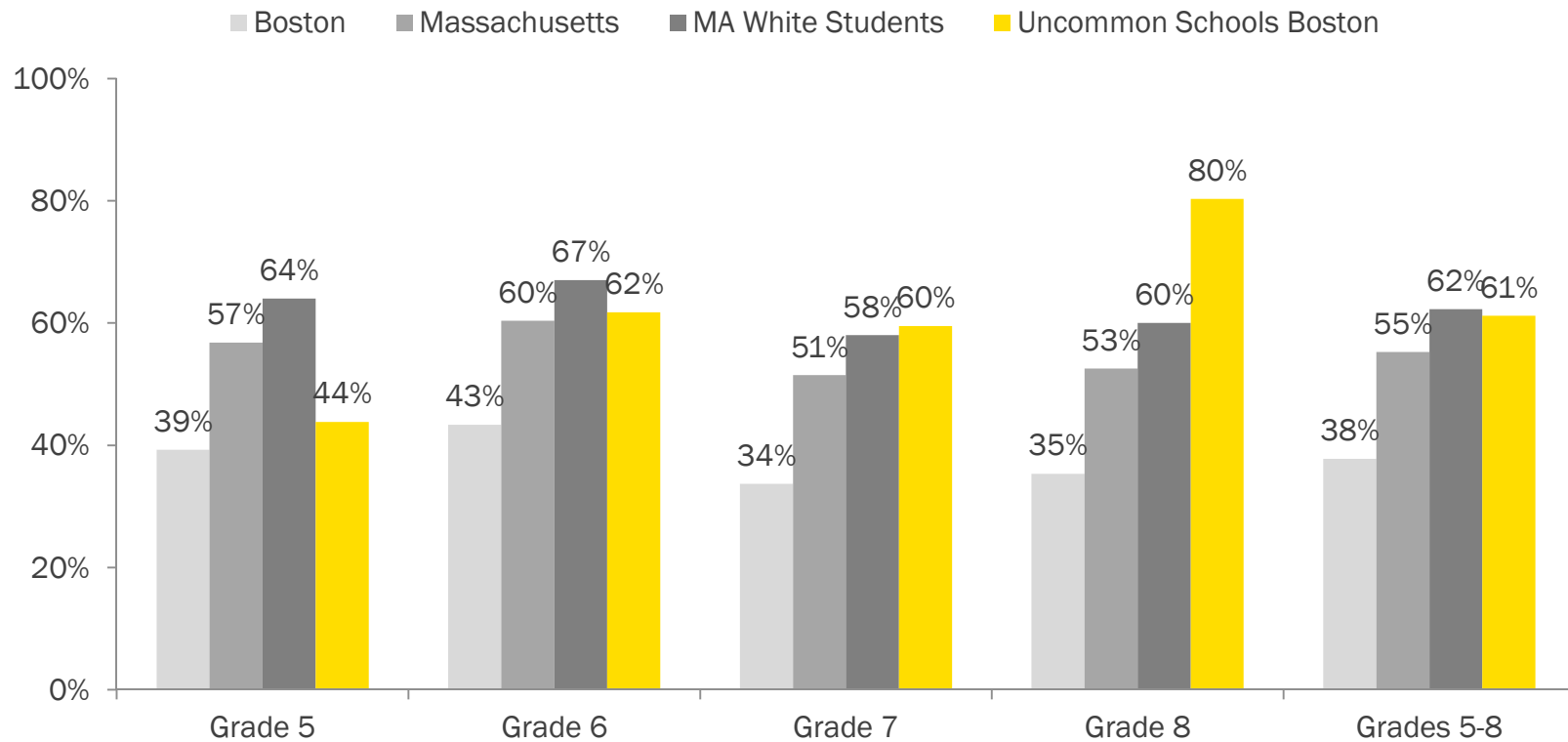
% of Students Scoring “Advanced” and “Proficient”

2012 Massachusetts Math Exam, Grades 6-8

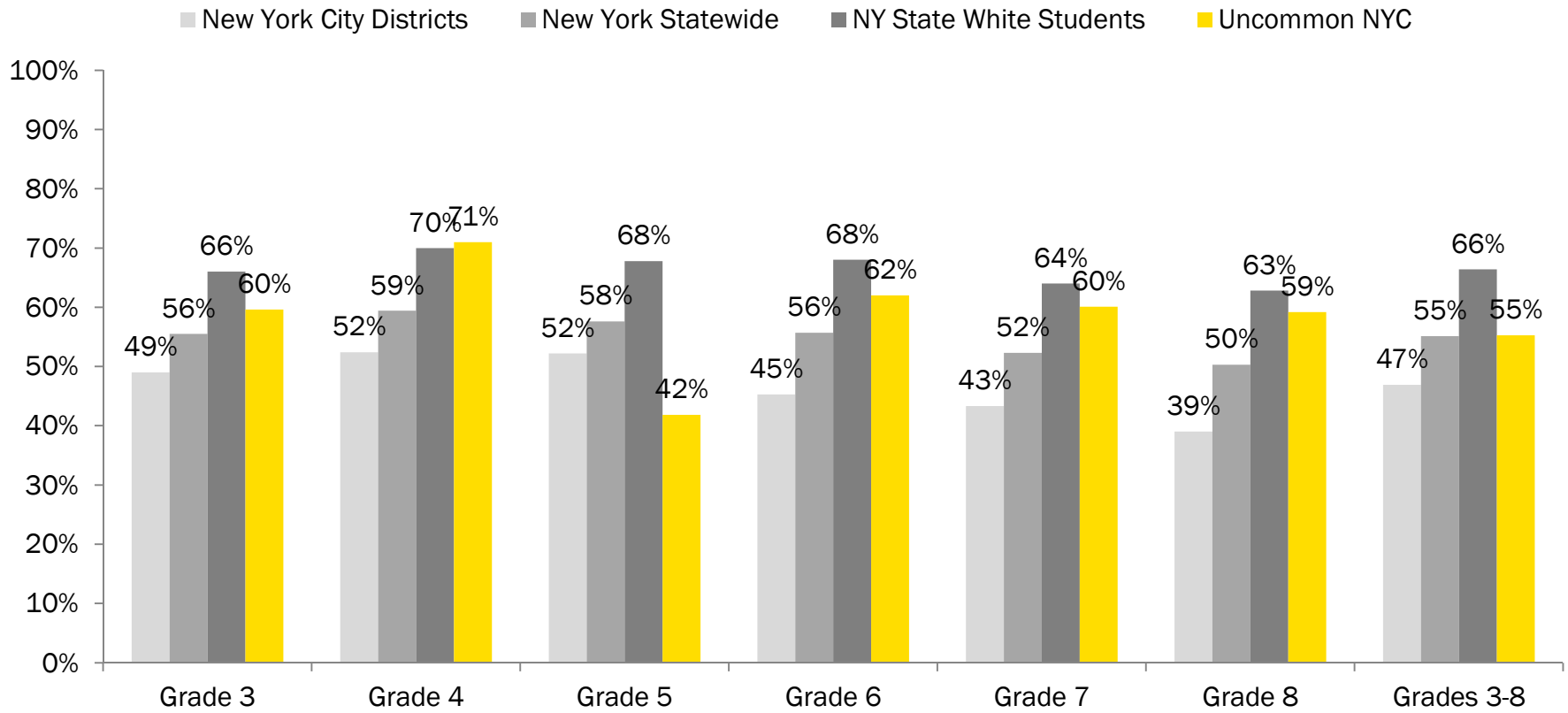
% of Students Scoring “Advanced” and “Proficient”

% of Students Scoring “Advanced” and “Proficient”

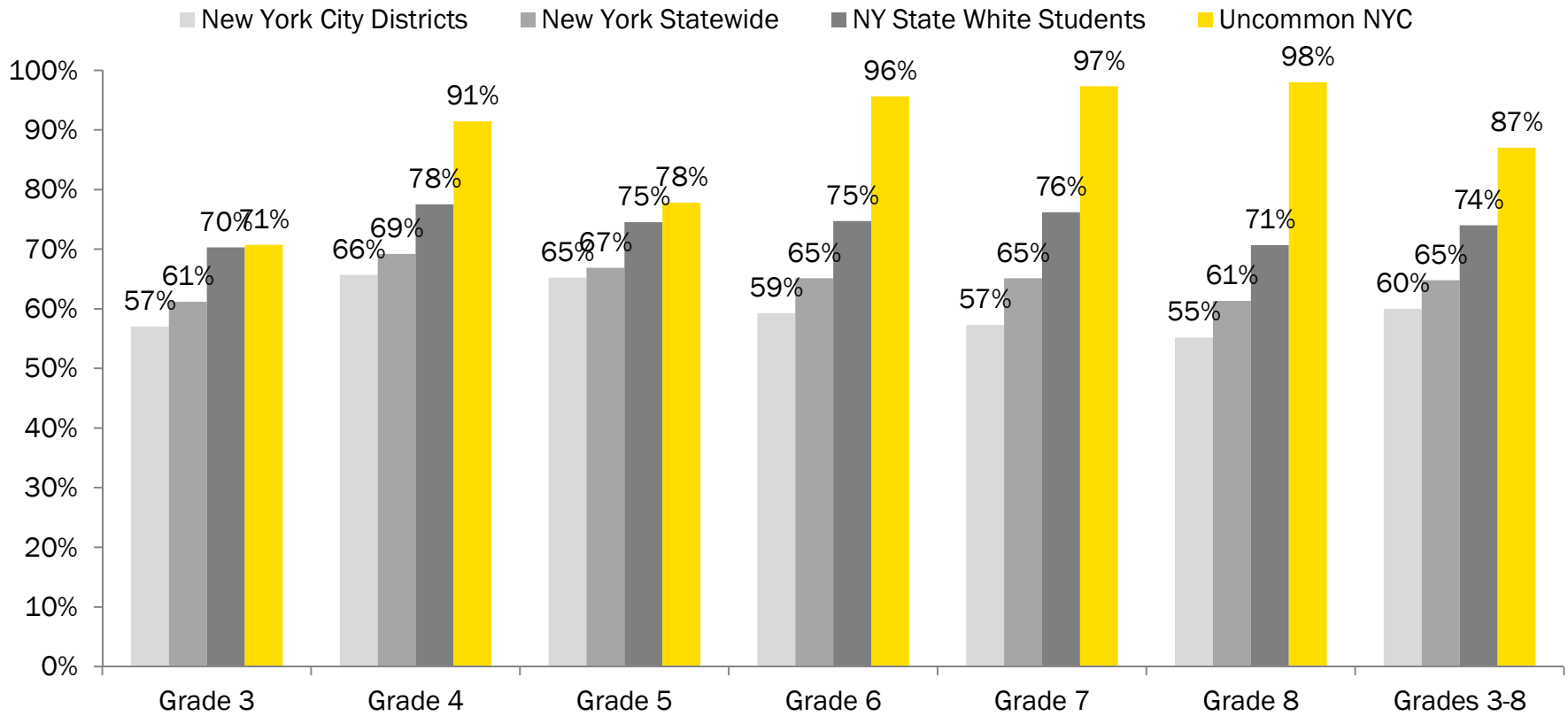

% of Students Scoring “Advanced” and “Proficient”

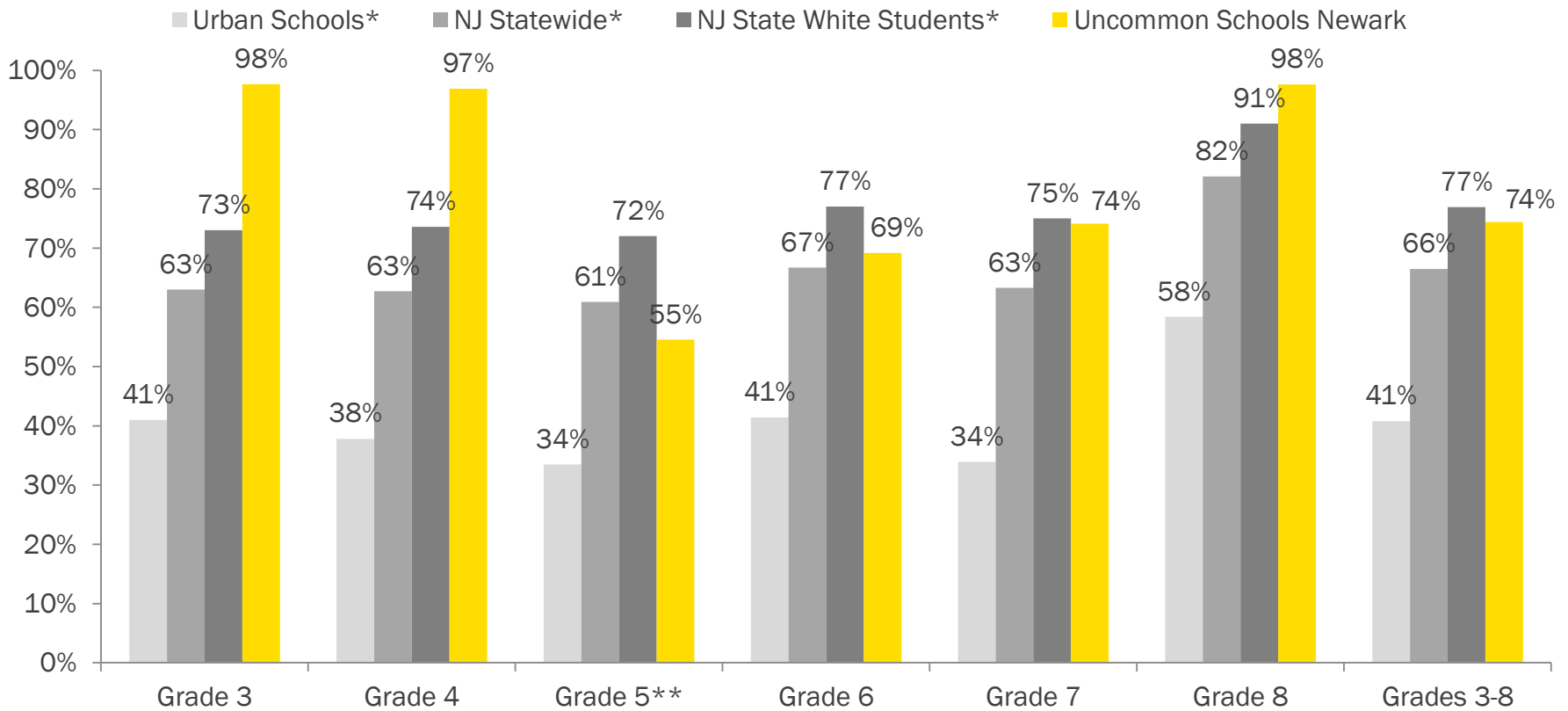

% of Students Scoring “Advanced” and “Proficient”



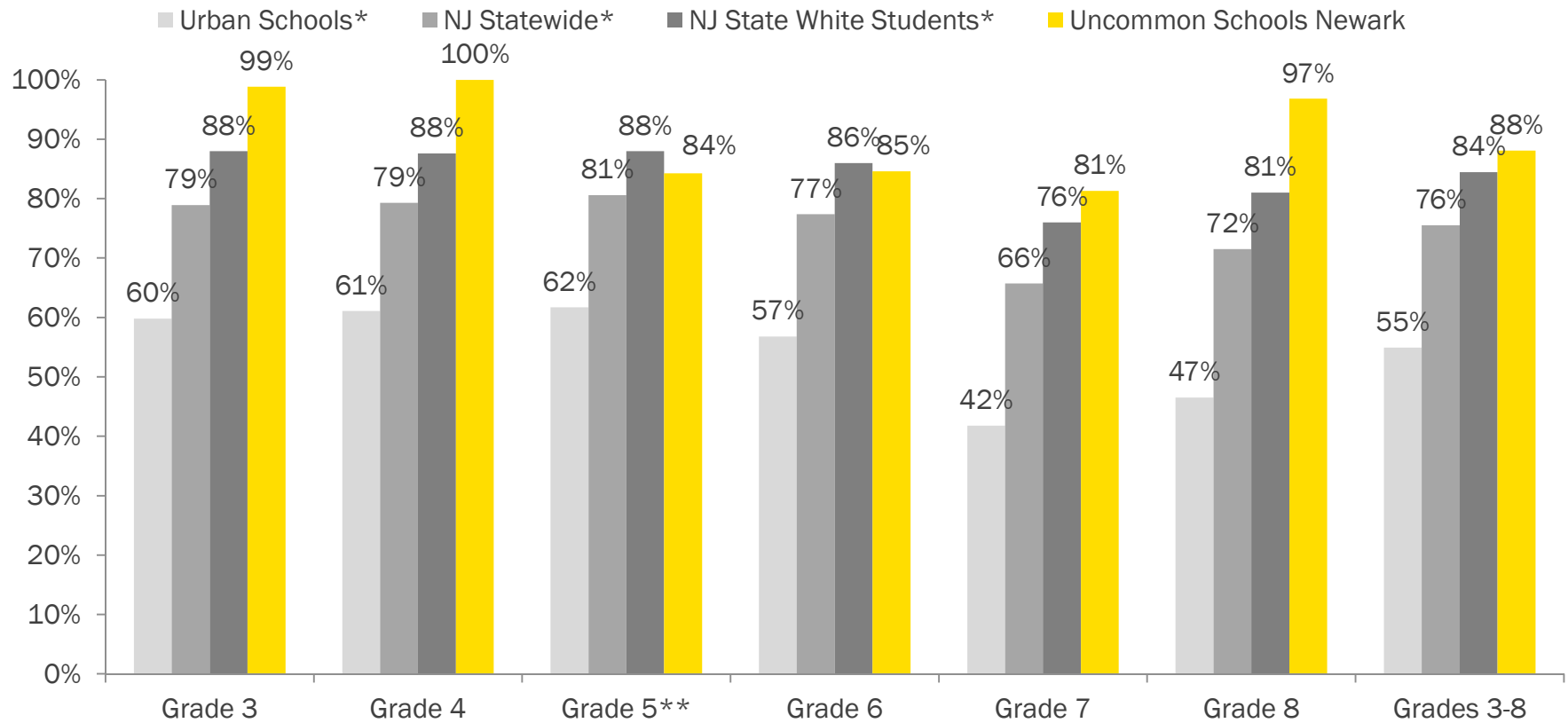
